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PROPOSED Drywell at 1302 N. 10th St. Boise, Idaho 83702

There is a problem area where standing water occurs due to lack of drainable soil where the downspouts discharge during heavy rains. We would install a drywell at this location and direct the downspouts to a drain box that will be connected to a drywell.

When we start, the existing conditions of the landscape will be photo documented for current conditions of surfaces where we will work. Please note: There may be discovery, once excavation is performed, that is beyond this scope of work. At that time, all work will stop until a change order is drawn up and signed.

Part 1: Install a drywell on the right side of the house. Digline will be contacted to mark utilities.

- 1. Install drain box for easy clean out.
- 2. Connect downspouts together with a Y and direct to drain box.
- **3.** Sucker truck to dig hole for drywell:
 - i. Excavate pit down to drainable soils or approx. 9 ft deep
 - ii. Line pit with fabric and install access pipe.
 - iii. Backfill with rock
 - iv. Lid to be installed on pipe at the surface for easy access
 - v. 16 x 16 paver will cover the drywell lid for easy locating and safety.
- 4. Cover with gravel, as needed.
- 5. Ness is not responsible for any landscaping except for the gravel and soil in the trench. Owner will be responsible for replacing sod, as needed.
- 6. Haul away excess soil and sod, if not needed.

Total Labor & Materials Part 1 = \$5,608.13

Part 2: Requested

1. Block/cover vent by the back door where pvc and galvanized lines are located with metal mesh and concrete.

Total Labor & Materials Part 2 = \$258.19
